Greetings to you at the beginning of this second full week of our fall semester at UNM-Gallup. We are thankful to our student senate for organizing the Welcome Back Week series of events that began yesterday with free donuts and continues with free snacks on Wednesday and giveaways on Thursday in the Gurley Hall Commons. I'd like to cast a light on a <u>recent statewide economic report</u> that quantifies UNM's economic impact, and I want to echo UNM president Garnett Stokes sentiments that this report "shows that UNM is making a significant economic contribution to the state and is driving economic and social prosperity even during a global pandemic."

Our UNM system accounts for 40,153 jobs, \$2.1 billion in annual labor income, and \$5.2 billion in economic output. UNM-Gallup joins with ounour students by providing a high -quality higher education right here close to home.

UNM VACCINATION MANDATE

I must remind you that we are fast approaching the September 30th deadline for UNM-Gallup faculty, staff, and students to upload their proof of full vaccination or approved religious or medical exemption. Individuals receiving approved exemptions will need to demonstrate negative test results for COVID-19. If you have not received a COVID-19 vaccine and have not received an exemption, this is the week to commit yourself to getting vaccinated for your own health and the health of our community.

The vaccines are safe, the Pfizer vaccine is FDA approved
